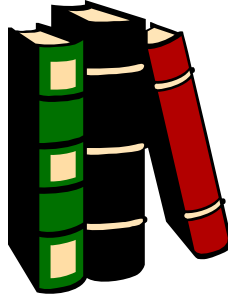

•National Archives in Washington, D.C. for military service records from Revolutionary War—1912.

•National Military Personnel Records Center in St. Louis, MO, for military service records from WWI—present.
